# Your home could be at risk of flash flooding.

Flash flooding is dangerous and can happen very quickly. The effects can have devastating impacts on property and be a risk to life.

The Environment Agency has identified your address as being located within a Rapid Response Catchment (RRC) and we want to ensure you are aware and prepared for the potential risk of a flash flood.

RRCs are areas where rivers are very responsive to extreme rainfall and can cause severe flooding even before flood warnings are issued. Although the local brook doesn't have a history of frequent property flooding, severe rainstorms are becoming more common and therefore increasing the likelihood of a flash flood.

Knowing what to do in a flood can significantly reduce the risk to life, property, and possessions.

## What you can do:

- 1. Be vigilant of weather forecast for heavy rain or thunderstorms. Download the Met Office Weather app and save your home location to be aware of their weather warnings or sign up to receive these by email at <a href="https://www.metoffice.gov.uk/about-us/guide-to-emails">www.metoffice.gov.uk/about-us/guide-to-emails</a>.
- Sign up for the Environment Agencies 'Rivers in the Forest of Dean' Flood
  Alert at www.gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings or call Floodline on 0345
  988 1188 or scan this QR code.



- However, be aware that flash floods can occur before there's time for warnings to be issued.
- 3. Sign up for the more localised flood Alerts from the Cinderford Community gauge, by emailing <a href="mailto:emergency@fdean.gov.uk">emergency@fdean.gov.uk</a>
- **4. Be prepared**. Think about what actions you would need to take. Complete your Flood Plan now and keep it somewhere safe. More information from your Local Authority can be found at <a href="https://www.fdean.gov.uk/environment/flooding/">https://www.fdean.gov.uk/environment/flooding/</a>.

## Think about what you can do NOW to be prepared:

- ✓ Sign up to flood warnings and the Met Office weather warnings.
- ✓ Move important documents and treasured items upstairs or somewhere high.
- ✓ Check if your house insurance covers flooding.
- ✓ Note the location of utility cut offs and complete the contact list below.
- ✓ Identify what you would need in a Grab Bag if you had to suddenly leave your home.
- ✓ Consider how you could stop water entering your property.

# What to do if a flood is expected:

## (ONLY if it's safe and you have time)

- Turn off your electricity, gas, and water supply.
- Raise up or move furniture and electrical items to safety.
- Hang curtains over rods and roll up and remove any rugs.
- Prepare a Grab Bag in case you need to leave inc. phone and charger, clothing and wellies, toiletries, medications, food and drink, essential items for children and pets.

#### And outside...

- Put any household flood resilience measures in place.
- Move your vehicle to somewhere safe.
- Relocate pets e.g. rabbit hutches to a safe place.
- Move or weigh down any loose garden items to prevent them floating away.

## Should you need to evacuate:

- Secure your property, take your grab bag, and inform family where you will be.
- If you are advised to leave your property, please think carefully before refusing; it may not be possible to rescue you if due to flooding the situation deteriorates and you've changed your mind.
- We will also inform you if a rest centre or place of safety is activated.
